Marcus,

New Premises Licence application in respect of The Hill, Ski Rossendale

Thank you for the consultation. As the local planning authority commenting on licensing applications, we focus the response on the effect of the licensable activities at the premises in question, on persons living and working in the area around the premises. Public nuisance is the reduction of the living and working environment of other persons living and working in the area of the licensed premises.

In the case of The Hill at Ski Rossendale, the local planning authority must **object** to the proposed license in relation to the playing of amplified music at this time. When planning permission was granted for a new café building (planning application no.2018/0105), it was subject to a condition (condition 4) which prohibits the use of a sound amplification system unless and until full details have been submitted to and approved by ourselves. This is in the interests of public nuisance and neighbour amenity, as the music has the potential to cause unacceptable noise disturbance to neighbours. No such application has been made to the LPA and as such, we must object to the granting of this license until such time that an application to discharge the condition has been submitted and approved.
