<p>Prevention of public nuisance</p>	<p>✓</p>	<p>This application to vary the terms of the license to allow the Village Stores to serve alcohol with no food will effectively turn the business into a bar. Removing the food restriction will attract greater numbers of people drinking alcohol to the establishment, they will be coming for the sole reason of spending the evening drinking and this will drastically change the atmosphere of the venue. The venue has a large outdoor seating area [REDACTED]</p> <p>[REDACTED] Without the food restriction, it will mean people will be able to [REDACTED] drinking late into the night. They will inevitably be noisy and this will disturb us, and especially my daughter. The Village Stores is on the end of a terrace of residential houses – it is simply not in an appropriate location to convert itself into a bar. I note in the application that they state they have no wish to become a ‘vertical drinking establishment’ but whether or not people are sitting down and drinking until 11pm or standing up will make absolutely no difference to the level of public disturbance they will make whilst sitting outside or when they are vacating the building.</p>

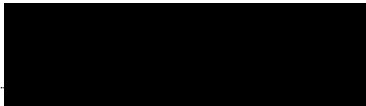
