4.	BACKGROUND	
4.1	In October 2011, an application for the grant of a premises licence was received	
	from Mr Irfan Ismail and that application was granted on 5 <sup>th</sup> December 2011.	
4.2	On 14 <sup>th</sup> September 2021, Mr Jenishkumar Patel applied to have the licence	
	transferred. That application was granted on 23 <sup>rd</sup> September 2021 and the	
	application had effect whilst pending.	
4.3	Mr Patel is the premises licence holder and is named on the licence as the	
1.0	designated premises supervisor (DPS).	
4.4	The premises licence is appended at <b>Appendix A</b> .	
4.5	The premises licence authorises the following activities:	
	Sale of Alcohol (Off)	
	Between 0730 hours and 1930 hours Monday to Friday	
	Between 0800 hours and 1930 hours Saturday.	

4.6	The conditions imposed upon the premises licence (bar from mandatory conditions	
	which the Licensing Authority have no discretion over) are appended as Appendix	
	<u>B</u> .	
5.	THE APPLICATION	
	On 19 <sup>th</sup> July 2022, an application to review the premises licence was received by	
	the Licensing Authority. This application was made by Trading Standards and is	
	appended at <u>Appendix C</u> .	
5.2	The application is made on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder.	
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	In accordance with the requirements of the Act, the application was properly served	
	upon the licence premises licence holder and all responsible authorities.	
5.4	In accordance with the requirements of the Act, the review application was	
	advertised at the premises by way of the statutory blue notice for a consecutive	
	period of 28 days. A notice was attached to the front door of the premises as well	
	as a lighting column to the side of the business. The application was also advertised on the Council's website.	
	advertised on the Council's website.	
5.5	Members are guided to paragraphs 11.27 and 11.28 of the statutory guidance	
	issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act which deals specifically with reviews	
	on this matter. That guidance being:	
	11.27 There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed	
	premises which should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of	
	the licensed premises:	
	<ul> <li>for the sale or storage of smuggled tobacco and alcohol.</li> </ul>	
	11.28 It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police, the Home Office	
	(Immigration Enforcement) and other law enforcement agencies, which are	
	responsible authorities, will use the review procedures effectively to deter	
	such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority	
	determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of	
	the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered.	
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-	<b>REPRESENTATIONS</b> No relevant representations were received during the representation period.	
	OPTIONS	
	Members should always consider whether concerns raised can be overcome by the addition of conditions.	
	Members should consider the application, the representations and all submissions	
	made and must take the steps below (if any) as it considers appropriate for the	
	promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:	
	1. To modify the conditions of the licence;	
	2. To exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;	
	3. To suspend the licence for a period of not exceeding three months;	

	<ul><li>4. To revoke the licence</li><li>5. To issue a warning (which must be written and given to the licence holder);</li><li>6. To take no further action.</li></ul>
