1. REASON FOR REFERRAL

1.1 To advise members of an application for the review of a premises licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 as well as a subsequent application for the transfer of a premises licence under Section 42 of the Licensing Act 2003.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 It is recommended that members determine the applications in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003.

3. LICENSING OBJECTIVES

- 3.1 Members are reminded of the Licensing objectives as follows:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - Public Safety;
 - The prevention of public nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm

4. BACKGROUND

- 4.1 On 22nd August 2013, a premises licence was granted in respect of the premises situated at 34 Burnley Road, Bacup.
- 4.2 The licence holder was Mr Zahoor Ahmed and is also the person named on the licence as the designated premises supervisor.
- 4.3 The premises licence is appended at **Appendix A**.
- 4.4 The premises licence authorises the following activities:

Sale of Alcohol (Off)

Between 1000 hours and 2300 hours Monday to Saturday Between 1000 hours and 2100 hours Sunday.

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- 4.5 The conditions imposed upon the premises licence (bar from mandatory conditions which the Licensing Authority have no discretion over) are as follows:
 - 1) The age verification policy detailed in the mandatory conditions shall stipulate an age of 25 years.
 - 2) A tamper proof CCTV system shall be installed, maintained and operated at the premises in liaison with and to the satisfaction of Lancashire constabulary and shall be used to record during all hours that the premises are open to the public.
 - 3) The recommendations of a crime prevention survey, carried out by the Police, shall be fully complied with.
 - 4) There shall be placed at all exits from the premises in a place where they can be seen and easily read by the public, notices requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 4.6 From 11th January 2023, there have been several attempts to apply to transfer the premises licence into the name of Ashia Kauser. All submissions have failed the technicalities required in order for the applications to be valid and they have been rejected.

5. THE APPLICATIONS

- 5.1 On 30th January 2023, an application to review the premises licence was received from Lancashire Constabulary. The application is appended at **Appendix B**.
- 5.2 The application is made on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm.
- 5.3 In accordance with the requirements of the Act, the application was properly served upon the premises licence holder (Mr Zahoor Ahmed) and all responsible authorities.
- The application to review was served on Mr Ahmed's relevant registered address which is the address given for the licence. There is some doubt as to whether this address is Mr Ahmed's current address and Lancashire Constabulary therefore served the application on all known addresses for Mr Ahmed.
- In accordance with the requirements of the Act, the review application was advertised at the premises by way of the statutory blue notice for a consecutive period of 28 days. A notice was attached to the front door of the premises as well as a lighting column to the side of the business. The application was also advertised on the Council's website.
- 5.6 During the representation period, 3 relevant representations were received. One representation was from the Irwell Ward Councillor, Andrew Walmsley. This representation supports the review application and is appended at **Appendix C**.
- 5.7 The second representation was from the Greensclough Ward councillor, Barbara Ashworth. This representation supports the review application and is appended at **Appendix D**.
- 5.8 The third representation was from Trading Standards as a Responsible Authority. This representation supports the review application and is appended at **Appendix E**.

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- 5.9 From 11th January 2023, there have been several attempts to apply to transfer the premises licence into the name of Ahsia Kauser. All submissions have failed the technicalities required in order for the applications to be valid and they have been rejected.
- On 21st February 2023 an application to transfer the licence from Mr Zahoor Ahmed was received from Miss Ahsia Kauser and this application was deemed valid and was accepted. The application was to have effect from 21st February 2023. The application is appended at **Appendix F**.
- 5.11 Lancashire Constabulary submitted a notice under Section 42(6) of the Act in respect of the transfer application. This was on the grounds that the granting of the application would undermine the crime prevention objective. This notice is appended at **Appendix G**.
- 5.12 Lancashire Constabulary have submitted further evidence and documentation in support of their review application and this is appended at **Appendix H**.
- 5.13 Members are guided to paragraphs 11.27, 11.28 and 11.29 of the statutory guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act which deals specifically with reviews on this matter. That guidance being:
 - 11.27 There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of the licensed premises:
 - ...;
 - for the illegal purchase and consumption of alcohol by minors which impacts on the health, educational attainment, employment prospects and propensity for crime of young people;
 - ...;
 - 11.28 It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police, the Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities, will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence even in the first instance should be seriously considered.
 - 11.29 The Government recognises that the majority of licensed premises operate responsibly and undertake due diligence checks on those who appear to be under the age of 18 at the point of sale (or 21 and 25 where they operate a Challenge 21 or 25 scheme). Where these systems are in place, licensing authorities may wish to take a proportionate approach in cases where there have been two sales of alcohol within very quick succession of one another (e.g., where a new cashier has not followed policy and conformed with a store's age verification procedures). However, where persistent sales of alcohol to children have occurred at premises, and it is apparent that those managing the premises do not operate a responsible policy or have not exercised appropriate due diligence, responsible authorities should consider taking steps to ensure that a review of the licence is the norm in these

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circumstances. This is particularly the case where there has been a prosecution for the offence under section 147A or a closure notice has been given under section 169A of the 2003 Act. In determining the review, the licensing authority should consider revoking the licence if it considers this appropriate.

6. OPTIONS

- 6.1 Members should always consider whether concerns raised can be overcome by the addition of conditions.
- 6.2 Members must consider whether to grant or reject the transfer application

Members should consider the review application, the representations and all submissions made and must take the steps below (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

- 1. To modify the conditions of the licence;
- 2. To exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- 3. To remove the designated premises supervisor;
- 4. To suspend the licence for a period of not exceeding three months;
- 5. To revoke the licence
- 6. To issue a warning (which must be written and given to the licence holder);
- 7. To take no further action.

8. CRIME AND DISORDER

- 8.1 Section 17(1) of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places a duty on the Local Authority to have due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of these functions on preventing in its area, the following;
 - crime and disorder;
 - misuse of drugs alcohol and other substances; and
 - re-offending.

The premises have recently failed a test purchase operation and sold alcohol to a 16 year old male, who was in company with a 13 year old female without any ID checks undermining the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Protection of Children from Harm licensing objectives and raises safeguarding concerns.

Incident 1

LC-20221023-1573

On the 23rd of October 2022, Lancashire Police received an online report from a member of the public reporting, that whilst waiting outside the premises, they saw children coming out with alcohol.

Incident 2

LC-20221126-0035

On the 26th of November 2022 a concerned parent reported that her daughter and friends had purchased Vodka from the premises and later became ill.

The shop was visited by PCSO Dolan on the 27th of November but were unable to provide any CCTV footage in relation to this incident, stating that the internet wasn't working. The shop assistant was asked if it was going to be fixed and he replied, "YES, SOMEONE IS COMING TOMORROW TO COME AND FIX IT".

PCSO Dolan revisited the premises on the 1st of December and CCTV was still not available, the assistant stating, "THE GUY WAS MEANT TO COME TODAY AND FIX IT BUT HE'S NOT TURNED UP. The shop assistant was asked if he had made attempts to contact the CCTV man, to which he replied, "NO"

Incident 3

LC-20221214-0700

On the 14th of December 2022, PCSO Hayhurst received information that a 14-yearold resident at a local childrens home had been buying cider on behalf of a nearby resident.

Incident 4

LC-20221217-0784

On the 17th of December 2022, in conjunction with Lancashire Trading Standards a test purchase operation was conducted at the premises. The assistant sold 2 cans of Carling lager to the 16 year old male volunteer.

CCTV was not working and when asked by the officer about it they replied, "SOME-ONE IS COMING TOMORROW TO FIX IT".

The Police licensing volunteer noted the following issues at the premises.

Statutory tobacco notice not on display No refusals log

No Challenge policy

No documented staff training

No till prompts

No internal/external CCTV

Within a 3-week period there have been 2 sales of alcohol to children and 3 failures to provide CCTV.

Whilst there are no conditions in relation to providing the CCTV, there is the following condition attached to the licence.

A tamper proof CCTV system shall be installed, maintained and operated at the premises in liaison with and to the satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary and shall be used to record during all hours that the premises are open to the public

The following options are available to the committee: -

- 1) Do nothing However the repeated sales and lack of compliance with CCTV show a lack of any responsibility by the DPS/PLH. It is believed that they have not had any involvement in the business since August 2022 and have failed to notify the Licensing authority of this
- 2) Modify the conditions of the licence The Police feel that modifying the conditions may have some impact in promoting the Licensing Objectives, but these modifications will have to be robust and proportionate. The new operators have shown a total disregard of their responsibilities to date.
- 3) Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor-It is understood that the DPS has not been involved in the business since August 2022 and is now run by new owners so this would be of no benefit.
- 4) Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
- 5) Revoke the premises licence so that no alcohol can be sold at all.

In the opinion of Lancashire Police, the information presented here indicates the total undermining of the Protection of Children from Harm Licensing Objective.

Lancashire Police respectfully requests that the committee considers whether revocation of the premises licence is proportionate – especially with the short timescale between sales.

At the very least, some robust licence conditions regarding CCTV and staff training and a suspension while these are implemented should be considered.

Subject: Bacup Wines - Review of Premises licence

Good afternoon

In respect of the above I would like to add my comments for the committees and officers consideration. These concerns are in the capacity of a Bacup Councillor, and Chair of the 'Solutions' project, where work going on to engage with and support young people. This project is hosted and led by Bacup Family Centre, its staff and community volunteers .

There are concerns raised regularly in by residents in connection with these premises. These include the sale of alcohol to young people without challenge, sadly there is a reluctance to report their concerns formally. Knowledge exists with the young people that this is the 'go to place ' as they will sell alcohol without age of the purchaser being questioned.

Work is ongoing in Bacup led by the family centre to support and guide young people, the work started against the backdrop of both actual and perceived ASB. Where licencing objectives are not being upheld, this work has the potential to be derailed. Drug and alcohol are factors for young people, and supplying alcohol underage is not protecting children from harm, nor is it helping with both actual and perceived public nuisance and ASB.

The number of failed test purchases in such a short time frame is a real worry for the community in general, and for the young people. This together with an absent DPS/PLH who in any event appears to have no connection with the business adds to the concerns. As does there regularly not having functioning CCTV nor dealing with its repair with urgency given it is a requirement of the licence.

I would urge the committee to reflect on the frequency and seriousness of these breaches and question who if anyone is actually addressing compliance with licencing objectives within the business?

LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL TRADING STANDARDS SERVICE

I am Lauren Manning, Senior Trading Standards Officer employed by Lancashire County Council Trading Standards Service.

I have delegated authority to exercise the County Council's powers and duties under relevant Trading Standards related Acts of Parliament and in this capacity to provide written and oral representations on behalf of the Lancashire County Council Head of Service for Trading Standards.

I make this statement using facts and matters within my own knowledge. Any facts and matters that are not within my own knowledge are true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

Lancashire County Council Trading Standards Service wishes to make representations in support of the application from Lancashire Police to review the premises licence at Bacup Wines, 34 Burnley Road, Bacup OL13 8AB.

I have checked our Lancashire Trading Standards database for information relating to the premises and can confirm that we hold the following information, for the last six years:

23/03/2017 – Trading Standards inspection of the premises resulted in the seizure of 13 packs of counterfeit Lambert & Butler cigarettes.

23/02/2018 – The shop owner at the time, Umair Shahid, was prosecuted for the offence of possessing counterfeit goods on 23/03/17, with a view to selling, offering or exposing for sale or distributing in the course of a business, contrary to the Trade Marks Act 1994. He was fined £75 and ordered to pay £85 in costs.

04/09/2018 – Inspection of premises. 4 incorrectly labelled e-liquids were seized from the shop, plus 18 packs of illicit tobacco seized from a vehicle linked to the shop.

27/12/2018 – Complaint received from a member of the public who stated that she purchased bottles of wine from the shop and she suspected them to be counterfeit.

12/03/2019 – Shop inspected. No illicit goods found.

01/09/2020 – The owner, Umair Shahid, was prosecuted for two offences of possessing for supply on 04/09/18, tobacco which was not in plain packaging, contrary to the Standardised Packaging of Tobacco Products Regulations 2015. He was fined £150 and ordered to pay £600 in costs.

24/05/2021 – Complaint received from the foster parent of a vulnerable underage female, alleging that the child was regularly purchasing alcohol from Bacup Wines and getting intoxicated.

17/06/2021 – Anonymous complaint received alleging that illicit tobacco products were being sold from the shop.

05/07/2021 – Illicit tobacco test purchase attempt using an adult test purchaser. No sale made.

16/08/2021 – Illicit tobacco test purchase attempt using an adult test purchaser. No sale made.

19/08/2021 – Test purchasing operation for cigarettes using 2 x 15 year old volunteers. Sale refused.

15/02/2022 – Anonymous complaint received alleging that e-cigarettes were being sold to underage children.

22/02/2022 – Illicit tobacco test purchase attempt using an adult test purchaser. No sale made.

03/10/2022 – Information received that illicit tobacco products are being sold from the shop.

28/11/2022 – Complaint received via Lancashire Police relating to underage sales of alcohol at the shop.

17/12/2022 – Test purchasing operation involving Trading Standards and Lancashire Police. Sale of 2 cans of Carling to the 13, 15 & 16 year old test purchasers. The seller identified himself as the owner of the shop, Mr Gulraiz Sharif.

Since this failed test purchase I have checked our Trading Standards national intelligence database, and found information inputted by Bury Trading Standards. The intelligence log states that they were called to an off licensed premises in Bury on the 23rd December 2020 by the Police on behalf of the landlord. The shop had been leased out and due to illegal activities taking place the landlord had used bailiffs to take the shop back. Inside the shop was illicit tobacco and alcohol. Bury Trading Standards and Greater Manchester Police seized cigarettes, hand rolling tobacco and 630 cans of foreign beer and 9 bottles of wine. They returned to the shop on 13th January 2021 after the landlord had found a concealment containing more illicit tobacco and cigarettes, which were seized. The landlord had leased the shop to an Ahsia Kausar. Gulraiz Sharif (her father of the same address) was the guarantor.

In the opinion of Lancashire County Council Trading Standards Service, the information presented is evidence that the prevention of crime and disorder and protection of children from harm licensing objectives have been disregarded at these premises.

I reserve the right to bring further evidence to any hearing, should any arise between now and then. I believe the contents of this statement to be true.

I am C' and I live at an address known to the Police. This statement relates to an incident in Bacup when I saw 3 children leaving Bacup Wines on Burnley Road, Bacup. At about 11am on 15th of October 2022 I was parked outside Bacup Wines on Burnley Road Bacup, waiting for my daughter to come out of the post office. I saw a girl and a boy standing outside the shop and another girl inside the shop. The 2 outside had there heads together as though they were discussing something and they were standing just out of view of the shop doorway. They appeared very nervous. The girl inside appeared to know the shop assistant and was laughing and joking with him. This girl came outside but then went back inside the shop and kept coming to the window and gesturing for the other 2 to go inside. The other 2 eventually went inside and all 3 of them were talking and laughing and joking with the shop keeper. After a couple of minutes the 2 children that had been outside originally,came outside and hid around the corner. The female who had been in the shop originally, came out holding a clear square glass bottle, containing a clear liquid and it had a red top. I didnt see the male shop assistant behind the till so i am not sure how the girl paid for the bottle. All 3 then walked off up Burnley Road. The shop keeper came outside the shop and watched the 3 children walking away. Within about 5 minutes the same group of children returned and the same female who had originally been inside the shop went back inside and began laughing and joking with the shopkeeper. She came out carrying an identical bottle that i had previously seen her with but I cannot be sure if it was the same one or a new one. I would described the shop keeper as been an asian male, mid to late 50s, with grey hair and wearing traditional asian clothing. He appeared to be slightly overweight. I would estimate all 3 children were aged around 13 years old. they definitely looked younger than them.

I an. and I am a care worker at a childrens home in Bacup, we are a home which looks after vulnerable. One of our young residents is a 12 year old male and he does look that age. In December 2022 our resident came home with E-Cigs and we questioned him where he got it from. He told us that he had got it from friends which we didnt believe. We then were told that someone from another care home had seen him in Bacup Wines on Burnley Road, Bacup with a £20 note, which they thought was unusual. We asked the young male about it and he told us that he had been helping an old man near to the shop and had been buying things,including Cider for him from Bacup Wines. I attended the old mans address with another carer, and spoke with the male. The old man admitted that he had asked the young resident to buy thinbgs, including Cider as he had no means to get it himself. Myself and the shop with the young male and the male behind the counter said that he didnt understand English but the young resident confirmed that the male had previously served him alcohol. i would describe the male as Asian, large build with close shaved head and aged around 50 years old. The young male said that other asian males who worked in the shop have sold him alcohol. We told the male that he shouldnt sell alcohol to the young male as he is only 12 but he shrugged his shoulders and said that he didnt understand and to speak with the boss at 7, on the 22nd of December the young male had £20 spending money. I went to the shop as the young male had left the home and i suspected that he had gone to the shop. As i drove past the shop, I saw the young male at the counter buying something. I couldn't stop immediately but parked close by and walked back to the shop just as the young male came out carrying an Ecig box, the young male ran away, so i went into the shop but the assistant denied selling it and when i said that i had seen him buy it, the assistant said that the young male had stolen it. I told the assistant that he was only 12.I think that it was a different assistant than previously as he was younger and spoke English without any problem. I returned to the home and the young was there and he admitted buying the Ecig from the shop. He also said that alot of his friends buy ecigs and alcohol from that shop I reported the incident to the local PCSO

I am PC 2973 BENTLEY of Lancashire Constabulary currently based at WATERFOOT Police Station, this is my statement in relation to an operation we conducted alongside with trading standards on the 17th of DECEMBER 2022.

The people I will be mentioning in this statement are myself, Lauren MANNING from trading standards and David PILL - who was acting on behalf of our licensing team and the shopkeeper Gulraiz SHARIF.

During the afternoon of the 17th of DECEMBER 2022, we had organised to do visits to local shops in the ROSSENDALE VALLEY area.

Our first visit was BACUP WINES due to Intel being recieved from sources that they were selling alcohol to underage members of the public. We conducted the check my sending three policie cadets in to the shop.

The cadets went into the shop and after around 5 minutes of being in there, they returned with some cans of carling. At this moment, myself, MANNING and PILL entered the store.

Once in the store, I approached SHARIF and told him that he had just failed a test purchase and that i needed his details so that he could be dealt with.

At this point, SHARIF started to speak as if he didn't understand what he had done, with him further creating a story that he had asked the youths for ID and that they said they were 20 years old, of which wasn't true due to incident being covertly filmed.

After this, SHARIF then passed us his card which contained his details.

He was then informed by MANNING that he would be under investigation by trading standards.

PILL then conducted the necessary licensing checks, with it becoming obvious that SHARIF had no answer for the majority of his questions. SHARIF explained that the cctv in the shop wasn't working but that, 'SOMEONE IS COMING TOMORROW TO FIX IT.'

I then left the store and waited for them to leave before further conducting tests.

On the 23rd of December 2020, trading standards were called to The Best One off Licence,1 Vernon Street, Bury by Greater Manchester Police on behalf of the landlord of the premises.

The shop had been leased out, and due to illegal activities, the landlord had used bailiffs to take the shop back.

On that day Trading Standards seized 400 cigarettes,700g of Golden Virginia tobacco and 200g of Amber leaf tobacco. Trading Standards also had 630 cans of beer with no English labelling and 9 bottles of wine signed over to them.

The landlord had leased the shop to Ahsia Kausar on the 23/07/20 and the guarantor was the business and stock were sold to Ahsia Kausar.

On the 13/01/21, trading Standards returned to the premises following a report from the landlord that further illicit tobacco had been found. On this occasion100g of Amber leaf tobacco and 200 Richmond Cigarettes were seized.

A crime report from Greater Manchester Police shows an offence of Dishonest use of electricity for the above premises, where the electric meter has been bypassed.
