Various highways issues: refuse at the side of the A56, bushes overhanging the highway at Blackburn Road (Edenfield) and unreadable road signs due to dirt on the Grane Road.	LCC Highways (in partnership with the Highways Authority)	A56 is the responsibility of the Highways Agency who regularly responds to litter complaints and organise litter picking as required. The overhanging bushes will be inspected and notices served on the landowner as required. The road signs on Grane Road are due to be replaced as part of the safety scheme to be carried out in August.
