ANNEXES**Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions**

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Conditions imposed by virtue of paragraph 6(8) Schedule 8 Licensing Act 2003

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means:

Between 1100 hours and 2400 hours Monday to Thursday.

Between 1100 hours and 0130 hours Friday and Saturday.

Between 1100 hours and 2400 hours Sunday only.

On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day.

Between 1100 hours and 0130 hours between 1st December and 2nd January.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

During the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;

During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;

During the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;

Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;

The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;

The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;

The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of state or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or

The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by person so supplied; or

The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

Where there is entertainment for children or an entertainment at which the majority of the persons attending are children, then if the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100 it shall be the duty of the person providing the entertainment to station and keep stationed wherever necessary a sufficient number of adult attendants, properly instructed as to their duties, to prevent more children or other persons being admitted to the building, or part thereof, than the building or part can properly accommodate, and to control the movement of the children and other persons admitted while entering and leaving the building or a part thereof, and to take all reasonable precautions for the safety of the children.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder when permitting for hire or reward, the building to be used for the purpose of an entertainment, shall take all reasonable steps to ensure the observance of the provision of the above provision.

No child shall be employed so long as he/she is under the age of 14 years to do any work other than light work or before the close of school hours on any day on which he/she is required to attend school or before 7 o'clock in the morning or after 7 o'clock in the evening.

clock in the evening on any day or for more than 2 hours on any day on which he/she is required to attend school or for more than 2 hours on a Sunday or more than 35 hours, or if he/she is under the age of 15 years, for more than 25 hours in any week in which he/she is not required to attend school or for more than 4 hours in any day without a rest break of 1 hour or at any time in a year unless at that time he or she has had, or could still have, during the period in the year in which he is not required to attend school, at least two consecutive weeks without employment.

No person under the age of 16 years and no child aged 16 years shall take part in any performance to which Section 37(2) of the Children and Young Persons Act 1963 applies, and in which his life or limbs are endangered.

Conditions imposed by virtue of being consistent with the operating schedule

All those conditions in the Operating Plan as outlined below.

Operating Plan

This Public House consists of three floors, the ground and first floor being public areas with a bar on both floors. The application is to licence all indoor areas for the purpose of licensable activity.

In addition both the front garden adjacent to the Highway and the rear beer garden are used for consumption.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

There will be a discreet and unobtrusive, strategically located CCTV system. Recorded images will be retained for 31 days and will be available to the Police upon request.

There will be no admission to the premises after 23:00 hours except for existing patrons who have made use of the outdoor consumption area and wish to re-enter the premises.

The owners will ensure:

- * Ongoing training of staff to recognise drunkenness and training to handle potential trouble makers and diffuse difficult situations.
- * Persons who are drunk within the premises will be refused service and asked to leave.
- * Any person found to be dealing drugs will be detained and the Police informed immediately. Drugs seized will be handled to the Police.
- * The premises and surrounding areas will be kept tidy.

Management will ensure that the Premises Supervisor or representative will attend wherever possible at the Pub Watch meetings.

Management will subscribe to the Town Centre radio scheme.

Glass Control

It is considered that the current use of glass vessels at the premises and the level of supervision by staff is adequate and the use of plastic glasses is not thought to be appropriate. The general environment and level of supervision and regular glass collections is considered sufficient to prevent dangers arising from the use of bottles as weapons.

The premises will, however:

- * Ensure all out-door banks are kept secure.
- * Ensure that glasses are collected on an ongoing basis making regular inspections for broken glass and clear up as necessary.
- * Ensure that any glassware used for consumption in the front garden or rear beer garden are removed promptly after use and that all glassware is removed when the use of those areas ceases.

Marketing and Promotion of Alcohol**Risk Assessment**

- * A full risk assessment is carried out by the Premises Licence Holder annually.

- * Consultation with local Fire Authority and other Responsible Authorities.
- * Ensuring that Public Liability Insurance is in place.
- * The management employ a Health and Safety consultancy to advise as to their risk assessments.

Occupancy Limits

The premises are not currently subject to an occupancy limit.

It is the practice of the Crown management to ensure that the premises do not become overcrowded so as to compromise the enjoyment of the facilities they offer. It is not considered appropriate to fix an occupancy limit.

Fire

- * Consultation with the local Fire Authority and other responsible Authorities.
- * Carrying out regular inspection and maintenance of Fire Extinguishers.
- * An adequate number of fire exits are provided and clearly marked and maintained to readily afford ample means of safe escape.
- * Means of escape and passageways and gangways will be kept clear and unobstructed during the whole time the premises are used for the licensable activities.
- * Emergency doors are of an approved type.
- * A fire alarm system is installed and checked regularly.
- * All interior and exterior passageways, gangways, staircases and steps leading to exits will be adequately lit.
- * Carrying out and keeping accurate record of regular safety inspections.
- * At all times there shall be adequate access for emergency vehicles. The access route shall be kept clear and free from obstruction, whether fixed or otherwise, at all times during which the premises is open for trade.
- * All fire safety signs shall be illuminated to allow them to be visible in the absence of light, natural or otherwise.

Emergency Lighting

In the absence of adequate daylight, the electrical lighting in any area accessible to the public, members or guests shall be fully operational when they are at the premises.

Curtains & Upholstery

All curtains, hangings, decorations and upholstery located on the premises shall be maintained in a flame retardant condition and shall be arranged so as not to obstruct exits, fire safety signs or fire-fighting equipment.

Adhere to fire regulations.

Electrical Installation

Temporary electrical wiring installations shall only be undertaken by competent qualified persons. Where this is not practicable all temporary electrical lighting shall be inspected and certified by a competent qualified person before it is put to use.

Adhere to fire regulations.

Food Provision

All staff involved in the processing and cooking of food have been properly trained in food hygiene requirements. All surfaces and equipment are maintained in a clean and hygienic condition.

Use of vermin proof bins.

Provision of secure facilities for empty glass containers.

Cleaning area around the premises on a regular basis.

Keeping all waste in covered bins.

Prevention of Public Nuisance**Nuisance from persons dispersing**

Management are aware that the premises are in a residential area and as such will have regard to the concerns of local residents and will ensure that there is appropriate signage requesting customers to leave quickly and quietly out of respect.

Management will encourage customers to use the services of a taxi company with whom they will have arrangements with regard to the manner in which patrons are collected from the premises. Drivers will be requested not to sound their horns, leave their engines running or park inconsiderately whilst collecting passengers. Details of the preferred taxi firm will be advertised within the premises.

Doors and windows will be maintained in a closed position whilst regulated entertainment takes place.

There will be no external disposal of bottles after 2300 hours.

If it is found that customers are parking inconsiderately, wherever possible, this will be brought to the persons attention either verbally or by use of leaflet.

The external areas (beer garden to the rear and garden area to the front of the premises) will not be used after permitted hours.

There will be no juke boxes, pool tables or performance of karaoke.

The designated premises supervisor or a person appointed by them shall conduct regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises and outdoor area and shall take steps to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause a disturbance to local residents.

All amplified music will cease by midnight on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays and will cease by 2300 hours on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Protection of children from harm

No persons under 18 are allowed in the premises at any time during which they are open for trade.

The following steps are taken by the management to ensure the strict admission policy regarding under 18's is followed.

- * Displaying prominent signage about the laws relating to children and alcohol.
- * Ensuring staff are fully aware of legislation and always vigilante.
- * Insisting that anyone who appears to be under 18 must produce ID or a proof of age card.
- * Stating clearly what forms of ID are acceptable and ensuring that all staff are aware of this requirement.
- * Suitable ID includes: passport, photo card driving licence, citizen card.

Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

A determination hearing on the 27th of September 2005 amended the operating hours in respect of licensable activities to those shown in this licence.
