This business is currently trading as a sweet and toy shop. Obviously the additional request to sell liquor in my opinion, will impact a poor impression to young children who visit these premises for the purpose of buying sweets or toys. It may encourage the risk of attempts to purchase alcohol for the under age drinking issues. Which I witness occurring around the Haslingden Towncentre.

We have in my opinion, sufficient retail businesses who sell alcohol in the Towncentre.

-newsagent in lower deardengate.

Aswell as all the public houses, and clubs around the haslingden towncentre.

To have the proposal of this premises to be licensed for the sale of Alcohol, will in my opinion put the increased risk of the activity of Anti-Social behaviour in this towncentre location. Especially with these premises opening times operating till 23-59pm people leaving
