ANNEXES**Annex 1****Mandatory Conditions**

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Each individual in the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority unless the premises or part of the premises where they are present are being used as wholly or mainly a restaurant or guest house, theatrical performances, plays or a Gaming Licence is for the time being in force in respect of those premises.

Annex 2**Conditions imposed by virtue of paragraph 6(8) Schedule 8 Licensing Act 2003**

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. This restriction does not prohibit:

- During the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of state or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by person so supplied; or
- The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

The conditions of the Indoor Public Entertainment Licence and the terms and conditions of Schedule 1 to the licence as per Annex 1 save for those conditions referring to usage times.

Annex 3**Conditions imposed by virtue of being consistent with the operating schedule**

The maximum number of persons including staff and performers shall not exceed 450 persons distributed with a maximum of:

200 on the ground floor
130 on the ground floor seating plan A
250 on the ground floor seating plan B

The ground floor seating plan B creating a High Volume Vertical Drinking establishment will only be used after 10 days prior notice is given to the Police Divisional Licensing Unit and will only be used after they have consented to the plan being used.

The licence holder and/or the designated premises supervisor or a person nominated by them shall be a member of and regularly attend at the meetings of the Pub, Club or Off Watch schemes for the area within which the premises is located.

A tamper proof CCTV system shall be installed, maintained and operated at the premises in liaison with and to the satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary and shall be used to record during all hours that the premises are open to the public.

Persons who appear to be under the age of 21 years shall be required to produce proof of age by way of one of the following:

- A recognised proof of age card accredited under the British Retail Consortiums Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS)
- Photo driving licence

- Passport
- Citizen card supported by the Home Office
- Official ID card issued by HM Forces or European Union bearing a photograph and date of birth of the holder

Any person unable to produce proof of age as above will be refused entry to the premises without exception.

The premises licence holder and the designated premises supervisor shall at all times comply with the Portman Group Code of Practice and with the requirements or recommendation of any Portman Group Retailer Alert Bulletin.

There shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises a sign, which is clearly visible to members of the public visiting those premises containing details of the trading hours under the premises licence.

No customers carrying open or sealed bottles shall be admitted to the premises at any time the premises are open to the public.

There shall be placed at all exits from the premises in a place where they can be seen and easily read by the public, notices requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly.

All external windows and doors must be kept closed after 2200 hours, other than for access and egress, when events involving amplified music are taking place.

No regulated entertainment will take place outside the premises in any area which is in the control of the licensee after 2200 hours save for any special events seven days notice of which has been given to the licensing authority and the Police.

No one under the age of 16 years will be allowed to enter or remain on the premises after 2200 hours save on Christmas Eve and New Years Eve.

All fire doors will be maintained effectively self-closing and shall not be held open other than by approved devices.

Notices detailing actions to be taken in the event of fire and other emergencies, including how the fire brigade shall be summoned, are to be prominently displayed.

Annex 4**Mandatory Conditions as per The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010**

These conditions came into force on 6th April 2010.

1. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2.) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children:
 - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in Section 159 of the Act);
 - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or

reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less.

- d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on:
 - i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Annex 5**Mandatory Conditions as per The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010**

These conditions come into force on **1st October 2010**.

1. (1.) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2.) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
2. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 (half) pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures

Annex 6**Conditions imposed by virtue of an order made by the Rossendale Magistrates Court on 19th July 2010**

Door supervisors will wear hi visibility jackets when on duty and ID badges must be clearly displayed.

Door supervisors shall be equipped with an appropriate method of keeping an accurate record of the capacity levels.

After 1900 hours on Friday's, Saturday's, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and New Year's Eve, no drinks will be served in either glass bottles or any other vessel or container made of glass. Any drink will either be served in a polycarbonate vessel or plastic bottle or alternatively, will be decanted into a plastic container or vessel before being given to the customer.

Printed notices shall be displayed prominently detailing the Challenge 21 scheme.

On Friday's, 1 door supervisor registered with the SIA will be employed at the premises from 2200 hours to 2230 hours, thereafter, 3 door supervisors will be employed at the premises until the premises closes.

On Saturday's, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and New Year's Eve, 2 door supervisors registered with the SIA will be employed at the premises between 2200 hours and 2300 hours, thereafter, 4 door supervisors will be employed at the premises until the premises closes.

The beer garden will cease to be used for the consumption of alcohol from 2300 hours daily.
