No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Conditions imposed by virtue of paragraph 6(6) Schedule 8 Licensing Act 2003

All conditions of Public Entertainment Licence transferred.

Conditions imposed by virtue of Paragraph 6(8) Schedule 8 of the Licensing Act 2003

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means:

Between 0900 hours and 2300 hours Monday to Thursday.

Between 0900 hours and 0100 hours Friday and Saturday.

Between 0900 and 2300 hours Sunday.

Between the end of permitted hours on 31st December each year until 0200 hours on 2nd January the following year.

Between the end of permitted hours on 24th December each year until 0200 hours the following day.

Between the end of permitted hours on 26th December each year until 0200 hours the following day.

Between 0900 hours on the Thursday, Sunday and Monday of each official English Bank Holiday at Easter, Spring, May and August each year until 0100 hours the following day.

Between 0900 hours on the Friday and Saturday of each official English Bank Holiday at Easter, Spring, May and August each year until 0200 hours the following day.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied: or
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

Where there is entertainment for children or an entertainment at which the majority of the persons attending are children, then if the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100 it shall be the duty of the person providing the entertainment to station and keep stationed wherever necessary a sufficient number of adult attendants, properly instructed as to their duties, to prevent more children or other persons being admitted to the building, or part thereof, than the building or part can properly accommodate, and to control the movement of the children and other persons admitted while entering and leaving the building or a part thereof, and to take all reasonable precautions for the safety of the children.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder when permitting for hire or reward, the building to be used for the purpose of an entertainment, shall take all reasonable steps to ensure the observance of the provision of the above provision.

No child shall be employed so long as he/she is under the age of 14 years to do any work other than light work or before the close of school hours on any day on which he/she is required to attend school or before 0700 hours in the morning or after 1900 hours in the evening on any day or for more than 2 hours on any day on which he/she is required to attend school or for more than 2 hours on a Sunday or more than 35 hours, or if he/she is under the age of 15 years, for more than 25 hours in any week in which he/she is not required to attend school or for more than 4 hours in any day without a rest break of 1 hour or at any time in a year unless at that time he/she has had, or could still have, during the period in the year in which he/she is not required to attend school, at least two consecutive weeks without employment.

No person under the age of 16 years and no child aged 16 years shall take part in any performance to which Section 37(2) of the Children and Young Persons Act 1963 applies, and in which his life or limbs are endangered.

The licence holder and/or the designated premises supervisor or a person nominated by them shall be a member of and

regularly attend at the meetings of the Pub Watch scheme for the area within which the premises is located.

The licence holder shall abide by the British Beer and Pub Association Point of Sale promotions standards for the management of responsible drinks promotions including happy hours.

All members of staff concerned in the sale of alcohol must be trained in the Portman Group Guide for Staff in Licensed Premises in saying no to under age drinkers.

Only glasses made of 'toughened glass' will be used whether alcohol is being consumed on the premises, or in any area outside the premises, which trades as part of the premises, where such glassware is commercially available.

Before the premises are opened for the purposes authorised by the licence, an inspection shall be carried out to ensure that the premises are safe for use. Details of the inspection, defects discovered and remedial action taken shall be recorded in writing in a logbook kept for that purpose. That logbook shall be made available for inspection on demand to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority, a Fire Officer or a Police Constable.

The maximum number of persons, including staff, allowed in the premises shall be 200.

There shall be placed at all exits from the premises in a place where they can be seen and easily read by the public, notices requiring customers and their vehicles to leave the premises and the area quietly.

Information shall be provided to customers and posted at the exit as to the nearest transport route and facilities.

A 'wind down' period will occur during a one hour period prior to the terminal time that the premises shall be open to the public during which quieter music shall be played. This condition does not infer any right to conduct licensable entertainment outside any period authorised.

The beer garden and any other external area provided for the consumption of alcohol shall be closed to the public at 2300 hours each day.

The management of the premises shall ensure that the grounds of the premises are kept tidy and the condition of which shall not cause nuisance to other neighbouring businesses or residents.

All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is in progress.

Persons who appear to be under the age of 21 years shall be required to produce proof of age by way of one of the following:

- * A recognised proof of age card accredited under the British Retail Consortiums proof of age standards scheme (PASS)
- * Photo driving licence
- * Passport
- * Citizen card supported by the Home Office
- * Official ID card issued by HM Forces or European Union bearing a photograph and birth date of the holder

No person under the age of 18 years shall be admitted to or be allowed to remain in the licensed premises after 2000 hours on any day.

No person under the age of 18 years shall be admitted to or be allowed to remain in the beer garden after 2100 hours each day.

No person under the age of 18 years shall be admitted to the premises or beer garden at any time unless accompanied by a person of 18 years of age or older.

The licence holder or his representative shall conduct regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises on every occasion the premises are used for regulated entertainment and shall take steps to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause a disturbance to local residents. A written record shall be made of those assessments in a log book kept for that purpose and shall include, the time and date of the checks, the person making them and the results including any remedial action.

Conditions imposed by the Licensing Authority at a determination hearing held on 22nd August 2005

The applicant shall seek advice from and implement any reasonable recommendation from the Fire Authority and Rossendale Borough Council's Environmental Health department in respect of preventing entrance to the beer garden from the car park after 2300 hours.

The conditions of the Public Entertainment Licence shall be retained but modified to increase the maximum capacity of the

licensed area to 200 persons.

The licensable activity shall be restricted as follows:

Sunday to Thursday 0900 hours to 2300 hours with the premises remaining open for an additional half an hour.

Friday and Saturday 0900 hours to 0100 hours with the premises remaining open for an additional hour.

Non standard timings granted as set out in the application.

Mandatory Conditions as per The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010

These conditions came into force on 6th April 2010.

1. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2.) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children:
 - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in Section 159 of the Act);
 - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less.
 - d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on:
 - i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Mandatory Conditions as per The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010

These conditions come into force on **1st October 2010**.

1. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an

age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- (2.) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

2. The responsible personal shall ensure that:

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:

- (i) beer or cider: 1/2 (half) pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures
