

KEY DECISION NOT INCLUDED IN THE FORWARD PLAN (GENERAL EXCEPTION RULE 15)

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Details of Decision to be taken:

Purchase 4 Terberg Orus 6 Food Waste Collection vehicles at a cost of £408,000 (utilising New Burdens funding from Central Government allocated for this purpose) to meet the demands of the service.

Clear Reasons why it is impractical to defer the decision until it has been included in the next Forward Plan:

All Local Authorities need to purchase new Food Waste Collection Vehicles to provide this service, causing a significant supply chain issue with vehicle manufacturers, leading to long lead times for vehicles.

If the 4 new vehicles are not ordered now we will be unable to deliver the Mandatory Food Waste Collections. In addition if the orders are not placed now we risk prices increasing as demand for vehicles increases and we will be subject to extended lead times which again may mean that we miss the April 2026 go live deadline.
