Lancashire Constabulary is applying for a review of the premises licence as we believe that the prevention of crime and Disorder, the Prevention of Public Nuisance and the Protection of Children from Harm licensing objectives are being undermined at the premises due to repeated underage sales at the premises.

In April 2024 the Police became aware of reports of Anti-social behaviour involving young people around the Rawtenstall Market, particularly when they were holding their "Foodie Friday" events. The information received stated that that underage children were purchasing alcohol from the Rossendale Food and Booze Store at 49 Newchurch Road, Rawtenstall and causing issues on the Market and in the surrounding area, including meeting for arranged fights and one underage girl who bought a bottle of vodka from the store and ended up semi-conscious and sick.

On 14th May 2024 Lancashire County Council carried out an underage sales test purchasing operation at Rossendale Food and Booze, 49 Newchurch Road, Rawtenstall and a 14-year-old test purchasing volunteer attempted to buy alcohol and a knife. The test purchaser was asked for proof of age ID and did not produce any, but the seller declined a sale of alcohol but did sell a knife, which was an offence contrary to s141A of the Criminal Justice Act 1988.

On the 14th of June 2024, whilst on licensing enquiries in Rawtenstall, PS 541 Dundon and an Officers from Rossendale Council saw a group of young females leaving the premises with a heavily laden bag. The girls were spoken to, and it was established that three 16 and 17 year old females had just been sold 6 cans of AU vodka from the premises. The staff member did not ask the children for any identification, and he received a Penalty Notice for Disorder for the sale of alcohol to a person under the age of 18 years.

A meeting was arranged with the premise licence holder, the Police Licensing Officer and Rossendale Borough Council Licensing to discuss the concerns arising from two sales of age restricted products to underage children in the space of a month. The meeting took place on the 23rd July 2024 and it became clear in this meeting that there was poor management and oversight at the premises. The PLH was asked to provide a plan to detail what he was going to do to address the issues, how he was going to do it, why he was going to do it and when it was going to be implemented by. This was to be provided to the Officers by Friday 26th July 2024.

On 26th July 2024 an email was received by Rossendale BC from the Premises Licence Holder in which he detailed his plan, and it is the view of the Police that this response was wholly insufficient to address the concerns raised in the meeting on 23rd July 2024.

On the 11th of October 2024 a test purchase operation was conducted by Lancashire Police with Lancashire trading standards using two girls aged 14 and 16-years old. The girls were sold a 700ml bottle of WKD. The seller again received a PND for the sale of alcohol and when asked about his training around underage sales, he stated that he had received training at the start of July when he first started work but made no mention of anything since and there was no record of him receiving any training.
